✓ ENROLL WITH MEDICARE

As of June 1, 2016, most dental practices that treat patients over 65 years of age are affected by a significant change to the Medicare regulations. If a dentist takes no action, patients with Medicare Advantage Part D prescription plans will not receive benefits when their dentist writes a prescription for them (which can result in a very disgruntled patient). Medicare recipients who purchase supplemental Medicare insurance policies (i.e., Part D drug plans) will be eligible for benefits from those plans only when the ordering doctor is <u>enrolled</u> in Medicare, i.e., opted in, opted out, or enrolled using the CMS 8550. Because enrollment is not immediate, dentists should submit the necessary documentation – or register online – to opt in, opt out or submit an 8550 form with Medicare <u>as soon as possible</u>, but no later than January 1, 2016.
